# tax hike

### Many Costa towns following suit

By Tom Cain ALFAZ DEL PI council has passed, with a majority vote, a rise

in three of the town's main municipal taxes.

The taxes affected by the decision are IBI, vehicle circulation

tax and construction tax.

Coming into effect next year, IBI taxes will rise by 11.76 per cent giving the council a projected 400,000-euro increase over the 3,400,000 it collected in 2006.

Tax councillor Toni Such said that the rise was necessary

because the IBI rate had not been revised since 1999.

The tax rises were agreed by all political parties except the

PP who considered them unnecessary. Sr Such said that despite the rise, Alfaz del Pi still had one of the lowest IBI tax rates in the area. He said that tax on an average dwelling in Villajovosa was 410 euros, In Benidorm 372, La Nucía

451, Altea 206 and in Alfaz del Pi 206. As the residents of Alfaz look forward to higher taxes in 2008, others living in towns throughout the Costa Blanca can expect similar increases as local councils look to swell their coffers to offset spending before the next local elections in 2011.

# **Baby Boom**

FOREIGN mums have helped Valencia Region's birth rate soar in recent years and health authorities are now supplying free information packs for expecting mums.

The packs are available in Spanish, Valencian, English, Arabic and Romanian.

They give important information on how to look after new-

born babies, breast-feeding and other post-pregnancy tips.

The number of births in the region has risen by 30 per cent in the past six years, going from 40,775 in 2000 to 52,803 in 2006.

This increase is mostly attributed to the growing number of foreign mothers, who now constitute 20% of the total amount of

births, compared to 4% in the year 2000. The majority of them come from Latin America (37%) followed by Eastern European countries (21%) and North Africa

Average ages of the new mothers go from 30 to 35 for the Spanish and Western European to 25 to 30 for the Eastern European, South American, African and Asian mothers.

# Port enlargement project paralysed

ALTEA council has reached agreement over the stopping of a Project, presented in 2003, to enlarge the port. Under the project, which was presented by

the PP via the Empresa Pública de Desarrollo Municipal, EPDM, the port would have been extended south to include moorings for passenger liners, an underground car park, leisure zone, diving school, cinemas, theatre restaurants and a port administration build-

Altea tax councillor Eloy Hidalgo said that

since the project was first presented in 2003, new information has been forthcoming which has highlighted flaws in it.

To that end the council has been able to count on the backing of all political parties to scrap the original project and instead look at renew ing the Club Náutico's concession.

He added that the yacht club had put forward a plan to develop new concessions in the port without having to make it any bigger.

This project would allow the public greater access to facilities while at the same time respecting the environment.
